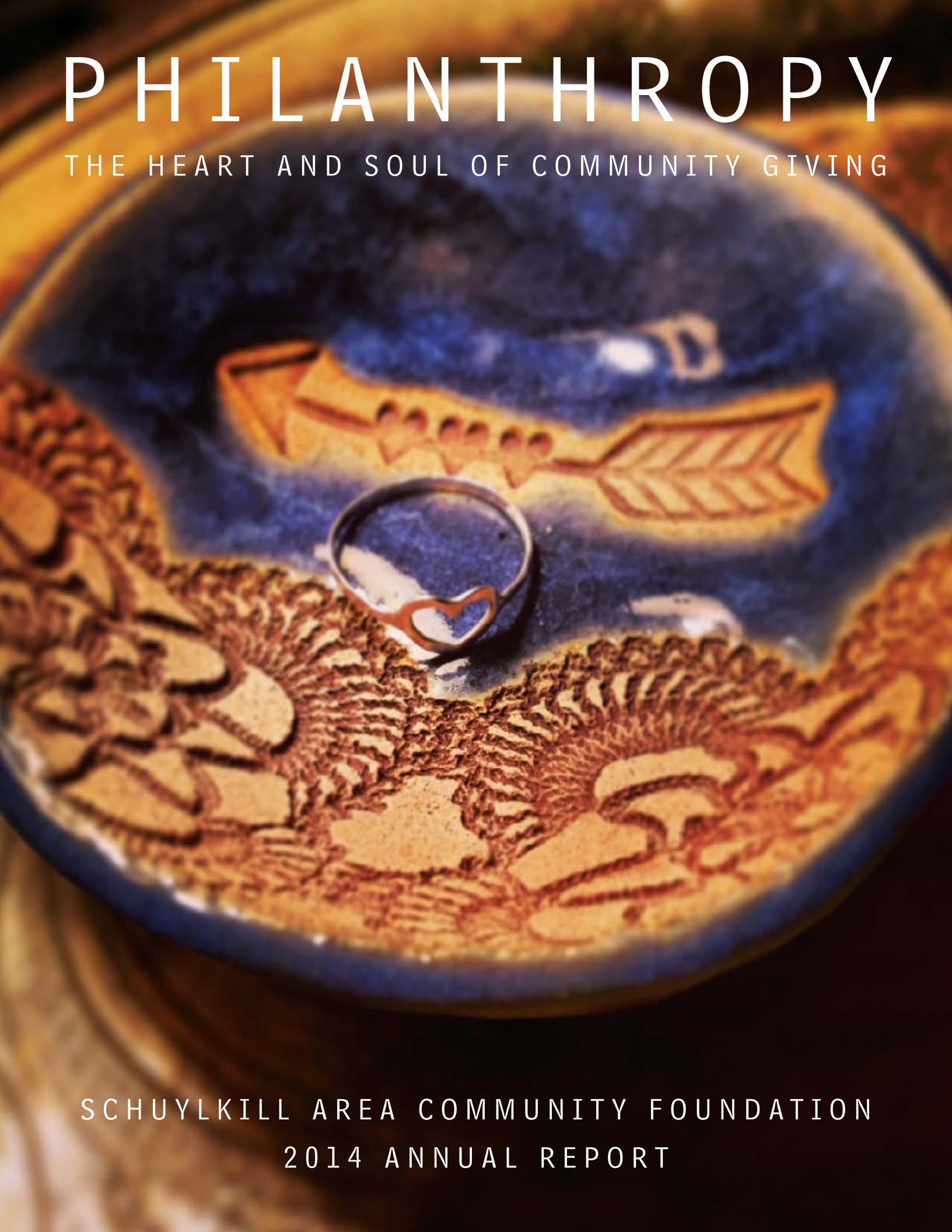

- Received gifts totaling \$689,350.75;

- Awarded grants of \$263,239.94 to one hundred eleven organizations;
- Worked with donors to add five new endowment funds;
- Hired a new staff person; and
- Continued to educate the community about the Foundation's services.

Designated Funds

Ongoing Support

Donors may create a fund at the Foundation to benefit specific organizations. In the event a specified organization ceases to exist, the Foundation is able to adjust the distribution to insure the fund carries out its original purpose and intent.

Donor Advised Funds

Involved Annual Giving

Through Donor Advised Funds, a donor can have an active hand in his or her charitable giving by having the right to recommend annually to the Foundation which organization(s) should be supported by the fund. Grants are then made, in the name of the fund, to qualified charities. Since the Foundation administers the fund, donors are assured of its permanence well beyond their own ability to advise.

Field of Interest Funds

Target Specific Issues

Field of Interest Funds provide donors the opportunity to support particular areas of interest that reach many organizations. The Foundation distributes earnings to the most appropriate programs within the areas of arts & culture, education, environment, health & wellness, and human services.

Scholarship Funds

Educational Support

Donors may create scholarships to support students who are graduating from a particular school, attending a particular school, or studying a specific field. Each scholarship is unique and is fulfilling the criteria set forth by the donor.

David R. Schmaldienst Music Award Fund

"Music Makes a Difference in a Young Person's Life."

David R. Schmaldienst, a native of Allentown, Pa, is the former Director of Bands at Tri-Valley Junior/Senior High School. He retired from teaching Instrumental Music in the Elementary School in 2011 in the Tri-Valley School District. He also taught at Tamaqua Area Junior/Senior High School, Deptford Township Junior/Senior High School, and Lower Cape May Regional High School of New Jersey.

Mr. Schmaldienst organized and directs the Tri-Valley Community Band. He is the former conductor of the Pottsville Third Brigade Band and assists with conducting the Cressona Band and the Anthracite Youth Orchestra. He also coached Bassoon Quartets and Woodwind Ensembles at Susquehanna University's summer music programs.

He is a member of the National Association for Music Education and is a past member and officer of the New Jersey Music Educators' Association. He is the Past President of District 10 of the Pennsylvania Music Educators' Association (PMEA) from 1993-1995 and again from 2001-2003 and has adjudicated numerous marching, jazz, and concert band festivals. He sponsored the Tri-M Music Honor Society at Tri-Valley High School. He also conducted

several Honors Band Festivals in Eastern Pennsylvania. He was the Co-Chairman of the Schuylkill County and PMEA District 10 Auditions Committee. Mr. Schmaldienst is the Principal Clarinetist with the Anthracite Philharmonic and the Cressona Band. He performs with the Pottsville Third Brigade Band, Schuylkill Big Band, After Hours Swing Band, Pine Grove Community Band, and the Tremont Community Band. He has performed as the second bassoonist with the Schuylkill Symphony Orchestra.

He received his Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from West Chester State College and completed post graduate work at West Chester and Wilkes College. He and his wife Judy, who is a retired music educator from the Pine Grove Area School District and is a private flutist instructor, are the parents of two sons and a daughter and grandparents to eight grandchildren.

David R. Schmaldienst Music Award Fund provides an award to a graduating senior of Tri-Valley High School pursuing post-secondary education and majoring in Music or a related field. The student must be accepted into a four-year undergraduate program on a full-time basis. Students will be considered based on musicianship, musical achievements, leadership, academic achievement, extra-curricular involvement, as well as financial need.

Richard and Mildred Sharp Memorial Fund

Mildred Sharp, a long-time resident of Shamokin, passed away January 21, 2013. She was born April 22, 1913, the daughter of the late Arthur and Florence (Kerstetter) Bixler. Mrs. Sharp was a graduate of Shamokin High School, Class of 1931, and Bloomsburg State Teachers College. She was a former teacher in the Lincoln School and a member of the First United Methodist Church in Shamokin. On May 30, 1947 she married Richard Sharp, who passed away April 10, 1988.

During her lifetime, she worked with E. Lori Smith, Financial Advisor with Waddell & Reed, and with Attorney James C. Bohorad to establish a bequest through her Last Will & Testament to support her charitable giving goals.

The annual earnings from the Richard and Mildred Sharp Memorial Fund will be distributed equally to the First United Methodist Church of Shamokin, the Shamokin High School Alumni Association, and the Shamokin/Coal Township Public Library as specified by the donor.

Wilfred C. La Voie Theatrical Fund

Anne La Voie, Shenandoah native and Wil's wife, established this fund as a memorial tribute for her husband, Wilfred Charles La Voie, who died August 2013 in Los Angeles.

Born in Troy, NY on February 17, 1932, he was the son of the late Wilfred and Mildred Smith Faille La Voie. Wilfred attended La Salle Institute in Troy where he found a home in the Dramatic Society.

During the Korean Conflict and Cold War, he served in the United States Navy, stationed aboard the aircraft carrier USS Hornet as a member of the flight deck crew responsible for electrical maintenance of jet aircraft.

After he returned from service, Wilfred performed in several theatres in New York including the Driftwood Showboat, The Coach House Players, Mid-Hudson Rep Company, as well as in radio plays. In 1979, he moved to Los Angeles where he was a member of Actors' Equity Association, the Screen Actors Guild,

and the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists. His credits from the Catskills to California encompassed sound stages and store windows, theaters, tents, and even a floating showboat. Los Angeles stage credits included premier performances of original work at The Court and Tiffany, as well as revivals of dramas, musicals, and comedies from "Guys & Dolls" to "You Can't Take it With You". On television, he appeared in episodic series ("LA Law", "Who's the Boss", "General Hospital"), and he did voiceovers ("Magnum, P.I.", "Quantum Leap") and commercials for Mercedes Benz and Bank of America.

In recent years he traveled to some of the ports he had visited "courtesy of the U.S. Navy" as well as visit family and friends across the United States, and from London to Lithuania. Wil's 80th birthday was celebrated with dinner at the Eiffel Tower in Paris and tea in London. He said he was blessed with a good life, a series of happy events.

The Wilfred C. La Voie Theatrical Fund will support Coach House Players, Inc. of New York, annually for the organization's scholarship program.

Dave Derbes Schuylkill River Watershed Conservation Award Fund and the Paul Lohin Schuylkill River Watershed Conservation Award Fund

Schuylkill Headwaters Association, Inc. has established two endowment funds with Schuylkill Area Community Foundation (SACF). The Funds will honor Dave Derbes and Paul Lohin, founding members of the Schuylkill Headwaters Association and deeply committed to improving the water quality in the Schuylkill River Watershed.

Dave and Paul have been actively involved in all functions of the organization, holding various offices, and supplying hands-on assistance with the implementation of abandoned mine drainage remediation projects. They are lifelong conservationists and environmentalists with a genuine love of the outdoors.

The awards will be distributed to qualified students who demonstrate a commitment to the community by participating in environmental and conservation projects or programs outside the classroom and who have maintained a cumulative G.P.A. of 3.0 or greater.

Dave Derbes Fund – will be granted annually to a graduating senior at Pottsville Area School District.

Paul Lohin Fund – will be granted annually to a graduating senior at Minersville Area School District.



The Heritage Society Award was created to acknowledge the professional advisors who trust the Community Foundation's ability to serve their clients. Arnold Delin was an integral part of the Jewish community of Pottsville, serving in numerous capacities including President of Oheb Zedeck Synagogue, Pottsville, for five terms. He was a member of B'nai Brith, Pottsville Masonic Lodge, and the Pottsville Jaycees. He was Regional Director for the Anti-Defamation League and Past President of the Schuylkill County Club. Above all, Arnold was a humanitarian and champion of human rights. He waged a lifelong battle against social injustice, intolerance, and discrimination of all forms.

REMEMBERING ARNOLD DELIN, 1925-2015

Arnold and his wife, Dolores, worked closely with the Community Foundation to sustain diversity education programs in Schuylkill County, specifically the Schuylkill Youth Conference and Arnold Delin Award Program which began in 2001. They continued to help students and educators learn about issues of tolerance and appreciation of diversity.

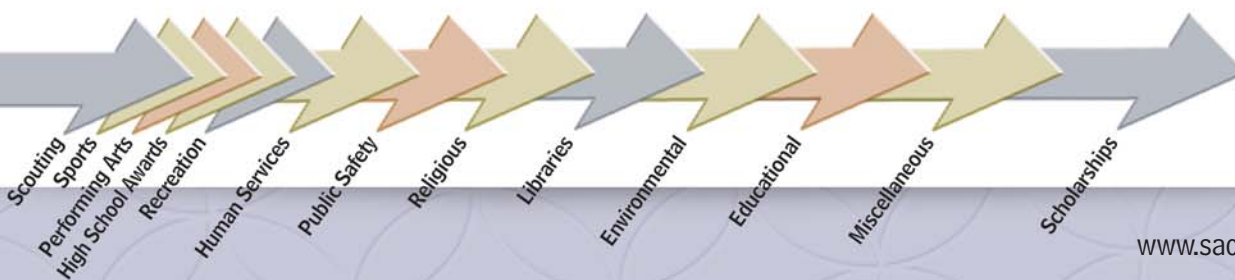
